# Governors' Report to Parents 2015-16

Welcome to the first Cambridge Nursery Federation Annual Report. Our Federation came into being on I January 2016 following the decision of the Brunswick and Colleges Nursery Schools Governing Bodies to federate under the leadership of our Executive Head Teacher Amanda Bannister.

For you, the parents and carers of the children at Brunswick and Colleges we hope that the transition has been seamless and that your children have enjoyed the wonderful experiences that both schools have offered in the last year.

One of the highlights of the nursery experience is the opportunity of accessing the Foundation Stage Curriculum through the outdoors and the chance to develop their physical skills on the varied equipment in both gardens. The gardens are regularly used to extend story telling, mathematical exploration through counting and looking at shapes and sharing in the care of the two Brunswick rabbits Boris and Minnie. Walks to local community facilities including the library, the allotment and a Chinese restaurant have also been used to extend their knowledge of the outside world. The nurseries have continued to share good practice with other nursery providers through working with the Cambridge Teaching School. One exciting development is that the first applicants for the new Initial Teacher Training for Early Years Teachers have been successfully recruited, including two of the Federation's staff who will begin their training in the autumn.

The Governors trust that you and your children have enjoyed being at Brunswick or Colleges and that you will take away many happy memories of the year with us. May we wish you well for the future.

## **Daisy Room - Colleges**

The Daisy Room has continued to flourish and from September will be concentrating on offering places to funded two year olds. We are delighted that the holiday play scheme is thriving and that children from both nursery schools come together to access this facility.







## A Learning Environment

Governors are responsible for the monitoring and evaluation of the School Development Plan to ensure that both nursery schools continue to develop and that we build on our current good practice whenever we can. We ensure that the first year of the Foundation Stage Curriculum is effectively planned and delivered by professionally trained staff at a level appropriate to individual children's learning.

The Governing Body has a Curriculum and Standards Committee, which meets termly to review the curriculum and to monitor through a series of in-depth visits the implementation of different aspects of the curriculum. In the last year we have looked at English as an Additional Language at Colleges, the Use of the Pupil Premium, Special Educational Needs and an overview of the nursery day.

Our aim is to make sure that the schools provide the very best of education for all the children so that when they leave Brunswick and Colleges they are ready for their new schools and for the new challenges and experiences they will encounter.

**Brunswick @ Buchan Street** offered two and three year olds in Kings Hedges an excellent start to their nursery life. Sadly due to circumstances beyond our control, the Governing Body have made the difficult decision to close the Buchan Street provision at the end of 2016 summer term.

Thank you to the children, parents and staff who have made this a wonderful facility and all the very best to the children, parents and staff for the future.

#### **Finance**

The nursery schools are provided with an annual budget to cover staff training, curriculum development and general maintenance costs. The Management and Resources Committee, which reports to the full Governing Body, monitors the finances regularly and a special meeting was held in May to approve the 2016-17 Budget.

We have joined with the other nursery schools in the county to make representations to the County Council about our concerns that we are not funded from within the schools budget and will continue to review the budgetary pressures that the nurseries are facing in the coming year.
