Mrs Crisp has planted some runner bean seeds with her daughters. What do you think is going to happen?

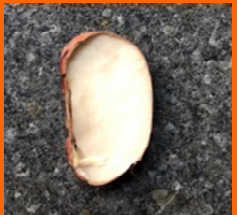


Mrs Douglas' sunflowers have grown more leaves.
